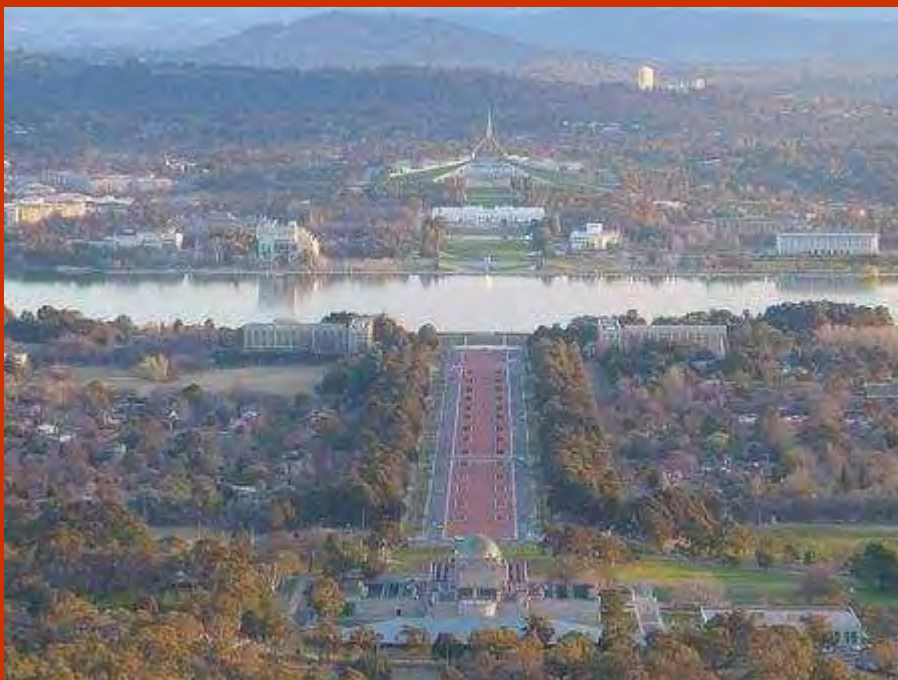

Old Parliament House is located in the Parliamentary Triangle on the south side of Lake Burley Griffin. There is a wide range of hotels within a few minutes drive of OPH, bordering the Triangle. ## Pre-Conference Tours

We are proud to offer three free pre-conference short tours in some unexpected places. These tours will take place in the afternoon of Friday 18 September will be complete by 4pm. Please choose one from the following:

### 1. **Breast cancer research at the John Curtin School of Medical Research, Australian National University**

The JCSMR is Australia's national and leading medical research institute. It was created in 1948, as a result of the vision of Australian Nobel Laureate Howard Florey and Prime Minister John Curtin. The school undertakes research in medical sciences and to bring clinical discoveries into application.

Dr. Anneke Blackburn will give a Board Room presentation on her current research project on the genetic factors involved in breast cancer susceptibility and non-hormonal prevention drugs. Also included will be a short tour of her laboratory.



This tour will take approximately 60 minutes. As parking is limited at ANU, transport to this tour will be only through the Carpooling Service.

### 2. **Deep space and the history of women in the US space program at the NASA Deep Space Communications Centre, Tidbinbilla;**

Glen Nagle will lead a short tour through the Space Centre displays. The Centre has a range of photographic and equipment displays, including the gigantic satellite dishes that track the NASA deep space programs such the Hubble Telescope, the Mars landings and Voyager program to outer planets. Moving to the theatrette, Glen will tell the story of women in the US space program, and give an astonishing PowerPoint display of the wonders from deep space.



This tour will take approximately 75 minutes. The Deep Space Centre is located at Tidbinbilla which is 35 kms from the centre of Canberra, and requires a 30 – 40 minute drive. Parking is free and plentiful at the Centre, and the carpooling service is also available.

### 3. Understanding global financial markets at the Royal Australian Mint with Rae Weston



The Royal Australian Mint was opened by HRH Prince Phillip in 1965 and its first task was to produce new coins for the introduction of decimal currency. It now has the capacity to produce 2 million coins per day.

This tour will enjoy the new visitors' centre, which includes views into the Production and Tool rooms and gallery exhibits on the history of Australian coins and medals.

In the new theatre Rae Weston, Zonta Club of Macquarie, will host an engaging and interactive discussion about the impact of the global financial crisis and share some of her recent research and insights. Rae's stellar career spans commercial, research and educational fields as a business woman, educator, author and business mentor. With expertise in a wide range of international financial and industry strategies and mechanisms, you will find Rae informative, practical and with plenty of humour.



This tour will take approximately 60 minutes. The Mint is located just minutes from OPH in Deakin. Parking is free and plentiful; and the carpooling service will be available.

## **Saturday Evening Dinner**

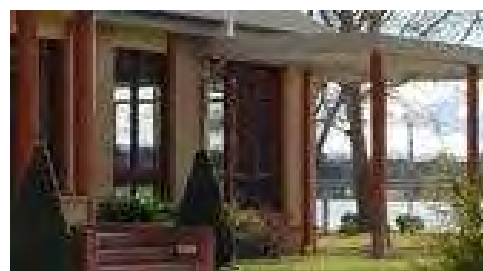
As a new event this conference you are invited to dine with a group at one of three select restaurants, providing a choice of prices and cuisines.

OPH is located centrally in the Parliamentary Triangle between Parliament House and Lake Burley Griffin. On May 9 2009, OPH was re-opened as the *Museum of Australian Democracy* and the history of Australian politics echoes through its corridors. Free guided tours of the Museum and the Cabinet Rooms are available at regular intervals everyday.

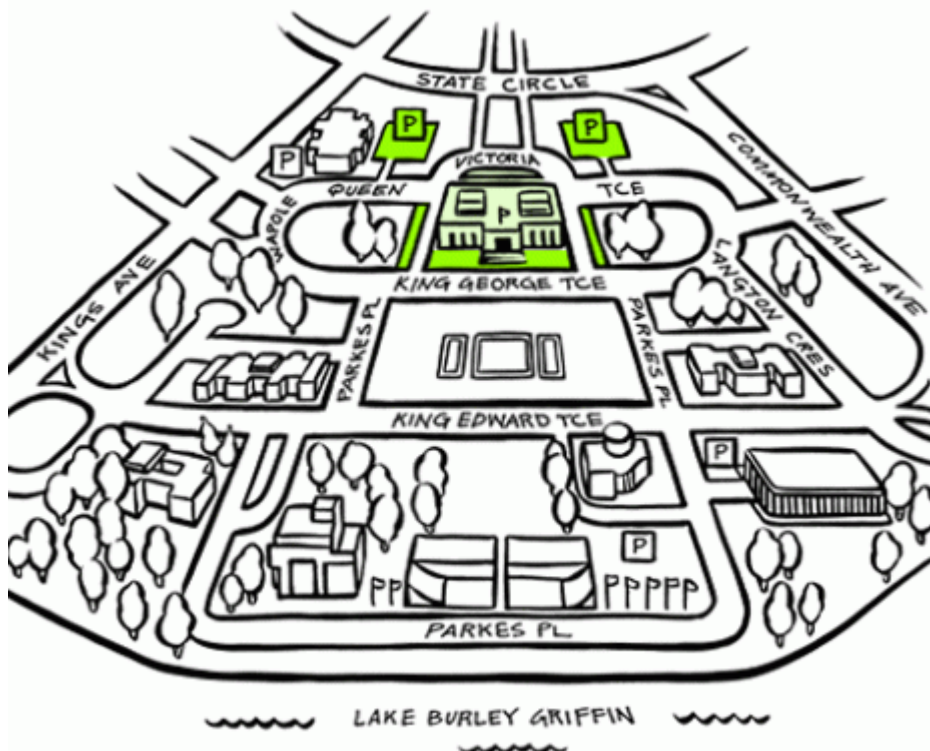

## **TRAVEL**

Canberra is located in the Australian Capital Territory, approximately 280 kms south west of Sydney.

Located on the ancient lands of the Indigenous Ngunnawal people, Canberra's name is thought to mean 'meeting place', derived from the Aboriginal word Kamberra. European settlers first came in the 1830s, and the area was chosen for the federal capital in 1908. Canberra's special contrast of nature and urban living was planned in 1912 by master designer, Walter Burley Griffin, a Chicago architect who won an international design competition. The provisional Parliament House (now OPH) was opened in 1927 in what was then a treeless paddock.

With a good highway system linking Canberra through surrounding NSW, driving to Canberra is simple. Allow approximately 3 hours drive from Sydney city, 3 1/2 from Blue Mountains and Northern Sydney; and 4 – 5 hours from areas such as Orange and the Central Coast.

There are 4 airlines flying domestically into Canberra Airport: Virgin Blue, Qantas, Tiger Airways and Brindabella Airlines. Canberra Airport is only 7 kms from OPH and about 8 kms from the city.

CountryLink offers two train services daily from Sydney; and Murrays Coaches and Greyhound Coaches run numerous daily services into Canberra city centre.

**Conference attendees are responsible for their own transport to Canberra**
